Currently we have 51 Journeymen on Book I, 11 on Book II, 2 Apprentice out of work, 7 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last week include: Massena CSD Door Access was a GC bid to Continental Construction who will sub the electrical to TEL Inc. (U) , Carthage CSD-New Storage Building went Jordstat (NU) for \$18,115, JCC-Sturtz Theater Lighting Upgrades will be done by Ridley Electric (U) for \$364,000, SUNY Canton-Cooper Service Complex Renovation was a GC bid to Northern Tier for \$332,300 who will sub the Electric to TEL Inc. (U), SUNY Canton-Nevaldine South Phase 2 went to Empire Northeast (NU) \$69,635, TI Bridge Authority-New Water Treatment Plant was GC bid to DC Builders who will sub electric- J&R (U), Village of Lowville- Mobile Water Treatment Plant went to New Century(U) for \$67,642, Samaritan Health-Women's Wellness went to Collins-Hammond (U).

Upcoming work includes: SUNY Potsdam Lehman Hall Phase VIII, SUNY Plattsburgh-Whiteface Hall, Canton CSD-Capital Outlay Project, SUNY Potsdam-Music Center Rehab, SUNY Plattsburgh Bathroom Renovations, Fort Drum Exterior LED lighting, Crown Point Central School-Auditorium Renovation, Champlain Border-A/V Upgrades, Appleton Arena Addition, Fort Drum ECIP, Westcotts Beach Cottages-Sitework, NYPA St. Lawrence Power Control Room, Clifton Fine CSD Bus Garage , Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, Norsk Titanium, a new development for a wind farm on Galloo Island, and the Mad River wind farms.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Westcotts Beach Cottages-Sitework went to JL Excavation who will sub electric to S&L (U).

School projects that are in various stages of development: Clifton-Fine \$3.6 million, Brasher falls \$10 million and Peru \$2.8 million, Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES \$18.5 million, General Brown \$9.37 million, Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, St. Lawrence Central \$17.7 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, Jeff-Lewis BOCES \$20 million, St Lawrence-Lewis BOCES \$43.5 million, Beaver River \$12 million.

I hope everyone exercised your right to vote today, it has been an interesting election season. I think everyone will be glad that the TV and Radio Ads are over and no more mailers. I am hopeful the United States House of Representatives turns to be Democratic Majority to keep the Trump Administration in check.

We have had several layoffs in the last week, mostly in the Plattsburgh area. A few Journeymen have gone back out to work. When compared to last year at this time we had 97 on Book I. Syracuse has open calls for work at both Fitzpatrick and Nine Mile Point nuclear plants, several of our members have gotten calls there and are working 10-hour days.

Work continues to be strong in several areas of New York State and Pennsylvania. If Journeymen are willing to travel their should be opportunities throughout the winter.

Everyone should have received the mailing from the Fund Office. Please examine the reports. If you do not think all of your benefits have been reported from the contractors you worked for, contact Mark Capone. As I always tell the apprentices, you should be saving your pay stubs every week to help verify the hours you worked. Also, you should have received a new Inside Agreement booklet. We have those printed so that you can keep it in your lunch pail and you can reference it on the job.
