Report at November '19 Regular Meeting

U=Union / NU = Non Union



Currently we have 63 Journeymen on Book I, 13 on Book II, 3 Apprentices out of work, 0 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Watertown City Schools - Entrance and Security Upgrades went to Dow (NU) \$268,492; Dana Hall at SUNY Canton was a GC bid to -Northern Tier for \$7,150,00; we are told they will sub electric to Watson(U); Dulles State Office Building-Auditorium Renovations to Dow(NU) \$1,244,000; and Chazy Water System Improvements to Triangle(U) \$95,400.

From Executive Board report;

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: St. Regis Falls CSD-Auditorium Lighting had Watson(U) low at \$75,197; Village Of Malone-Generator went to BGR Power(NU) \$5,415; Carthage CSD-Capital Outlay Project went to Tel Inc.(U) for \$52,000, however if they take alternates Watson is low; South Jeff CSD-Lighting Replacement went to S&L(U) for \$45,000, Lake Flower Exterior façade had S&L low bidder at \$44,000.

Upcoming work includes: Fort Drum Museum, Town Of Lewis-Salt Storage Shed, Jay Community Center, SUNY Canton-Wicks Hall, Ogdensburg Airport-Runway Lighting, Cranberry Lake Campground-Water System Improvements, Watertown International Airport-Runway Rehab, Ogdensburg Wastewater Upgrades, Belleville-Henderson CSD-Capital Outlay Project Rebid, South Jeff CSD-Lighting Replacement, SUNY Canton-Smith Hall Renovation, Carthage CSD-Capital Outlay, NYPA- Headgate Upgrades, SUNY Plattsburgh-Memorial Hall, Several Olympic Regional Development Projects in the Lake Placid area, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, the Number Three, Deer River, Roaring Brook and the Mad River windfarms. There are several solar projects.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Peru \$2.8 million, Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES \$18.5 million, Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, St. Lawrence Central \$17.7 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, Jeff-Lewis BOCES \$20 million, St Lawrence-Lewis BOCES \$43.5 million, Beaver River \$12 million, Copenhagen \$5.9 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million and Norwood-Norfolk \$9.1 million.

The out-of-work list has grown from 48 to 63 in the last two weeks. We expect hiring in the Plattsburgh and Lake Placid area this Fall so that should put some of the recently laid off Journeyman back to work.

Dow Electric took two nice jobs in Watertown recently. My theory is that they are low balling these jobs because their Traffic Signal Crew can not work in the winter and they are looking for work for some of those guys.

I attended the Governor's presentation last week in Clayton where he announced funding related to Lake Ontario and St. Lawrence flooding. The only project that has any significant amount of electrical work is the Waddington waste water plant reconstruction.

The various building trades have a meeting scheduled December 6th with Jett Industries, who is the General Contractor for the Ogdensburg waste water project that has the PLA. I am pretty certain that all of our work will be subcontracted to one of our contractors, but many of the other trades will supply workers directly to Jett. I learned that Jett Industries Inc. is a subsidiary of Kiewit Corporation. Kiewit is one of North America's largest and most respected construction and engineering organizations.

I attended a public hearing in Lowville by the New York State Assembly Minority Taskforce on learning for work. The Assemblyman wanted public comment on how New York State can better prepare students to enter the trades. When I addressed the group, I explained our apprenticeship program and how a BOCES graduate still starts at the bottom because of how extensive our program is. They asked me for one piece of advice and I told them to hold all programs to a very high standard.

This week, I began negotiations for the Northern Credit Union contract. It looks like it will be a long negotiation, which has been the case in the past. I will have Champlain Telephone Company negotiations in December.

The training center addition is coming along well; the metal fabrication on the stairs and manhole is complete, the overhead door has been installed, the heat and parament power should be on tomorrow. Thank you to Travis Flint, Mike Rhubarb, Alan Smith and the Apprentices who have worked on it.
