Report at November 2020 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 50 Journeymen on Book I, 10 on Book II, 1 Apprentices available, 0 Residential, CE, CW's and 1 Tele-data Technician available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include:no bid results to report.

From Executive Board meeting;

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Sunmount DDSO Condensing Units and AHU Replacement Project went to Watson (U) for \$119,000; ORDA Refrigeration Plant was a GC Bid to Mollenberg & Betz for \$11,550,000, they listed the electric sub as O'Connell (U); SUNY Canton – Wicks and MacArthur Hall Replace Switchgear and Electrical Panels went to Dow (NU) \$840,000 (next bidder was S&L at \$1,031,000); Town of Essex – Water Treatment went to Triangle (U).

Upcoming work includes: NYPA- Headgate Upgrades, NYPA – Saranac Digital Substation in Caddyville, Roth Industries – Addition, Champlain Border Crossing Passenger Administration Area, NYSDEC Field Office & Maint. Bldg. Louisville, Heuvelton CSD Capital Improvement Phase III, Rebuild Kehoe Parking Lot and Walks, Town of Peru - Pump Station Reconstruction Rebid, Village of Philadelphia Water Supply Improvements, Ft. Drum - New Railhead Loading Facility, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateauguay facility, the Number Three, Deer River, and the Mad River wind farms. There are several solar projects in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million, Massena \$49.6 million and Madrid Waddington \$5 million.

I hope everyone took the time to vote. I am sure all of us will be relieved when all of this is over, I am hopeful a result is determined in a timely fashion.

Work continues to hold strong with Book I reduced by 7 since the Executive Board meeting on October 20th. We also have 8 JW's on short calls at this time. We have another call on the recorder this evening for more JW's for the Rt. 11 Solar in Mooers, that may get to Book II.

New York State has come out with some additional guidance on the new sick time law; however, it does not address any different regulations for multi-employer workers or the construction industry. According to the regulation, employers should have begun accruing leave on September 30, 2020. Leave must be accrued at a rate not less than one hour for every thirty hours worked.

I inquired with our Attorney and as far as he knows none of the other Unions he works for have addressed this in a contractual nature. The responsibility of this law is solely on the employer. However, the State will allow Collective Bargaining Agreements with Unions that are entered into after September 30, 2020 to not require to provide the sick leave described above. The agreement must provide for a comparable benefits/paid day off for employees and specifically acknowledges the provisions of Labor Law 196-b.

This year we will not have Christmas parties. With the uptick in positive tests for COVID-19, it would not be safe to hold gatherings of that size.

The Fund Office has mailed out the yearly statements, everyone should have received them by now. I encourage all Local 910 members to compare your pay stubs with what is reported by the Fund Office. If you see anything that does not appear correct please contact Mark Capone as soon as possible.
