Report at November 2023 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 56 Journeymen on Book I, 4 on Book II, 12 Apprentices available, 4 Residential-CE/CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Community Health Center Canton-Link Electric (NU), SLC Arts Renovation-Ed Dean, Ogdensburg Airport Gateway Improvements-Collins-Hammond \$61,000, Upstate, St. Lawrence Boces-Empire Northeast (NU), SUNY Canton Kennedy Hall- TEL Inc., Upstate Correctional Facility Rec Pens-Next Era Dropped out next lowest bidder was Weydman \$3,228,347, Louisville Water Treatment Plant Upgrades-S&L \$540,000, Champlain Valley Boces Phase 2-Dow (NU) \$192,600, and South Jefferson CSD-Watson \$102,251.

From Executive Board Report: Alice Hyde Medical Center Renovation-S&L No Price; replace Blower for WWTP City of Watertown-Gardner Denver Nash (NU) \$31,544; Newcomb Community & Historical Center-Rozell East \$211,200; St. Lawrence Psych Center BLDG 203 Chiller Replacement-Collins Hammond \$97,000; Generator Install Norwood Municipal Building-Dow Electric (NU) \$73,420; replace Lighting SUNY Canton Athletic Recreation Center-TEL Inc. \$386,411.

Upcoming work includes: Brasher CSD Capital Outlay Project, Potsdam Walmart Supercenter, Northeastern Clinton CSD Phase 3, HVAC Upgrades at Norsk Titanium in Plattsburgh, Sanitary Sewer Improvements Westport. St. Lawrence County Public Safety Complex Canton, Install Generator Norwood Municipal Building, Provide Congregate Recreation Pens for building 28 Gouverneur Correctional Facility, New Highway Garage Town of Lyme, Rehabilitate Building St. Lawrence Suds Canton, and Construction of Temporary Terminal and Demolition of Existing Terminal Watertown Airport.

This week I am attending training through the International Foundation of Employee Benefit Plans. I will earn a certificate for Multiemployer Trust Fund Administration.

EDF Renewables contacted me about two projects that are continuing to move forward: The 119 MW Tracy Road Project in Jefferson County, and the 240 MW Rich Road Solar Project in St. Lawrence County. We will be looking for our membership to support these projects as they move forward.

We have started negotiations with The Champlain Telephone Company. We have two more meetings scheduled for next week.

President Cooper has issued a new IBEW Organizing Policy. Justin, Dave, and I will be meeting with our International Representative to discuss the changes and how they affect Local 910.

Laborers Local 17 has received a \$365,000 NYSEDA grant to train their workforce for Solar Installations. With the amount of solar work proposed in our area everyone is looking to get a piece of the work.
