Report at January '20 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 67 Journeymen on Book I, 6 on Book II, 4 Apprentices out of work, 2 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Camp Colby EEC- Multi Use Building went to Weydman(U) for \$156,950.

From Executive Board Meeting;

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: SUNY Plattsburgh - Memorial Hall Rebid was a GC Bid to MLB Construction for \$11,496,000, we have been told the electrical will be subbed to S&L Electric(U); and Beaver River Central - Capital Improvement Project went to Northern Pioneer(U) for \$768,376.

Upcoming work includes: Ogdensburg Wastewater Upgrades, SUNY Plattsburgh-Memorial Hall, Town of Plattsburgh Pump Stations, NYPA- Headgate Upgrades, SUNY Plattsburgh - Memorial Hall Rebid, Beaver River Central - Capital Improvement Project, Alexandria Bay Central – Capital Outlay Project, Champlain Valley Educational Center – Capital Project, Ausable Forks - Water System Rebid, Town of Clayton - Cerow Recreation Park Arena Addition, City of Plattsburgh – WRRF Dewatering Upgrades, Several Olympic Regional Development Projects in the Lake Placid area, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, the Number Three, Deer River, Roaring Brook and the Mad River wind farms. There are several solar projects in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Peru \$2.8 million, Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, St. Lawrence Central \$17.7 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, St Lawrence-Lewis BOCES \$43.5 million, Beaver River \$12 million, Copenhagen \$5.9 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million, Norwood-Norfolk \$9.1 million, Massena \$49.6 million and Madrid Waddington \$5 million.

We have had a few calls for work in the Adirondacks recently. Both the Saranac Lake Resort and the Headquarters building at the Bob Sled and Luge tracks are getting closed in and should continue to hire more members.

We are seeing many new projects out to bid. They include: Edwards Knox CSD – Capital Outlay Projects, replace Roof at St. Regis Mohawk School, Champlain Fire Station – Addition, ORDA Olympic Center Revitalization Project – Phase I Tunnel, ORDA Olympic Sports Center Condensing Unit Replacement, ORDA Whiteface Mtn - Pump House #1 Phase II, South Lewis School – Capital Improvement Project and SUNY Potsdam – Bishop Hall Building #9

I travel to Albany tomorrow for New York State Business Managers meetings on Wednesday and Thursday. The 3rd District Vice President will be attending as well as International Reps, District Organizing Coordinator, State Political Coordinator, IBEW Business Development and our Lobbyist. The Governor's State of the State Address will be tomorrow so we will get the Lobbyist's take on that. It has been reported that New York is facing a \$6 billion budget deficit. It will be interesting what he has to say about fixing that. Other State issues to be discussed at our meetings are the definition of Public Work, Design Build and Renewable Energy.
