Report at December 2022 Regular Meeting

U=Union / NU = Non Union

Currently we have 55 Journeymen on Book I, 6 on Book II, 1 Apprentice available, 2 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Sunmount DDSO – REBID Phase 1 Crawl Space Abatement ended in a tie, S&L(U) and NextEra(NU) both bid \$46,000.

From Executive Board report:

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Town of Lisbon – Install Emergency Generator at Highway Garage went to Sparx Construction(NU) for \$42,922, Canton CSD-Capital Outlay Project went to Watson(U) for \$2,188,000, Cumberland Bay State Park-New Maintenance Building went to S&L(U) for \$266,000.

Upcoming work includes: Water Supply Improvements – Au Sable Forks, Brasher Falls School – Capital Outlay, St. Lawrence Seaway – Power Upgrades, Renovate Memorial Hall, SUNY Plattsburg, Emergency Department (Addition/Renovations) Clifton-Fine Hospital, Au Sable Forks Fire District New Fire Station, SUNY Potsdam - Carson Hall Renovation, Potsdam School. There were several smaller projects for ORDA, as well as several large solar projects in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million, Madrid Waddington \$5 million and Potsdam \$23.5 million.

The work situation remains about the same, although the weather is causing some challenges for the Solar Farm sites.

It has been reported that the site work will begin this month for the Solar manufacturing plant adjacent to the Watertown Airport. No word yet if any electrical work has been bid.

Michels Power Construction Manager, Daniel Kiehn, met with Travis, Alan, and myself this morning to brief us on the upcoming substation work Michels has with the New York State Power Authority. Dan has been up here before; he had a supervisory role back in 2005 when Michels built the Chases Lake substation and the Rector Road collector substation for the Flatrock Wind farm. The upcoming work includes three (3) large substation additions he referred to as greenfield sites and 3 operating substations he called brownfield sites. The brownfield sites are in Churubusco and Massena. They have about 4 months work on them. The Greenfield sites are larger projects in Croghan, Massena and Chateaugay. These will start around Memorial Day and will continue through 2024.

This is my last Regular Union meeting as Business Manager/Financial Secretary of Local 910. It has been a privilege to serve in this position and I want to thank everyone for their support over the years. I ask that everyone support Travis Flint in the same way, as he begins his new journey as your Business Manager.

Lastly, I want to wish everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
