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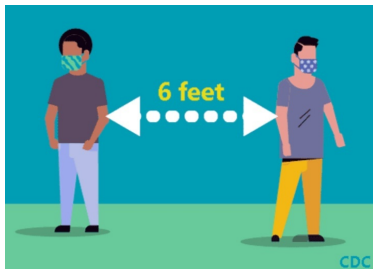

ATTN JOURNEYMEN

The newest group of apprentices have begun to be placed with our signatory contractors.

Some things to think about when working with apprentices;

STEP 1: PREPARE THE APPRENTICE

- Put the apprentice at ease; let them know how important they are and that you are sincerely concerned about them. Be sure they understand that they are - ***our future!***
- State the job task and determine what the apprentice already knows about it.
- Get the apprentice *interested* in learning.
- Position the apprentice to properly observe your performance of the job task.

STEP 2: PRESENT THE JOB TASK

·Tell, show and illustrate – ONE IMPORTANT STEP AT A TIME – Stress each key point.

·Instruct clearly, completely and patiently; but *never* more than the apprentice can comprehend and master at one time.

STEP 3: TRY-OUT PERFORMANCE

- Have the apprentice do the job – correct errors as they perform the task the 1st time.
- Make sure they understand *each* step.
- Continue until you are confident that the apprentice can perform the task correctly.

STEP 4: FOLLOW-UP

- Allow the apprentice to perform the task on their own, designate what they should do if they need your assistance.
- Encourage questions and safe work practices. Check performance frequently.
- Taper-off on coaching and follow-up, as each task is mastered, and apprentice begins to demonstrate confidence and ability.
- ***As a Journeyman, it is your responsibility to coach, mentor and discipline the apprentice – resulting in the development of a proud, competent IBEW Journeyman.***

Remember - "If the apprentice hasn't learned....the Journeyman hasn't taught!"

Report at June '20 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 92 Journeymen on Book I, 10 on Book II, 7 Apprentices available, 4 Residential, CE, CW's and 1 Tele-data Technician available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include:Harrisville CSD - Boiler/ Corridor Ceiling Replacement- went to DOW (NU) for \$132,648; Watertown CSD - Smart Schools went to Watson (U) for \$1,370,500;Copenhagen CSD Electrical Site Work went to Powis Contracting (NU) for \$87,000; Copenhagen CSD - Additions and Alterations went to Dow(U) for \$162,500; South Jefferson CSD went to S&L (U) for \$145,000; Carthage CSD Capital Improvements Phase 1 went to Dow(NU) for \$1,173,430, (they were \$296,570 low that is 25%); Town of Brownville Water District Electric Re-bid went to New Century(U) for \$165,160; Massena Capital Improvements Phase 1 went to Perras (U) for \$613,000 and O'Connell Electric(U) has the substation at the Roaring Brook wind farm.

From executive Board meeting

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include:Town of Peru Trunk Sewer Main and Pump Station Reconstruction was a GC Bid to Rifenburg for \$3,469,495 - Electric will be subbed to Weydman (U).

Upcoming work includes:SUNY Plattsburgh-Memorial Hall, Town of, NYPA- Headgate Upgrades, Ausable Forks - Water System Rebid, Town of,ORDA Olympic Center Revitalization Project – Phase I Tunnel, ORDA Olympic Sports Center Condensing Unit Replacement,PSU Hawkins Hall Courtyard Garden, ORDA Olympic Sports Complex – Site Data Upgrades,Ticonderoga WWTP Ventilation Improvements, NYSDEC Camp Colby EEC – Multi use Building, ORDA Olympic Snow Melt Boiler Installation,NYPA – Saranac Digital Substation in Caddyville, Town of Peru Trunk Sewer Main and Pump Station Reconstruction, Kring Point state Park Medium Voltage, Fort Drum – UAV Shadow Hangar, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateauguay facility and the Number Three, Deer River, Roaring Brook and Mad River wind farms.Several solar projects are in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development:Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million, Norwood-Norfolk \$9.1 million, Massena \$49.6 million, Madrid Waddington \$5 million.

We have recently been struggling to fill calls in all areas of the jurisdiction.Some of the Journeymen are waiting to be called back from a Covid-19 related lay-off.Currently we have 2 open calls, one in Potsdam and one for Fort Drum.

The bidding has tailed off after a very busy last couple of months.As you heard, Dow continues to bid aggressively; nobody knows how they will find manpower during the busy summer season on the school jobs.

I was contacted last week by Congresswomen Elise Stefanik's chief of staff asking for help in coordinating a job site visit to highlight that the construction industry is moving forward during the pandemic.Specifically, how Union construction workers are functioning during these times. She was scheduled to visit the Jeff-Lewis BOCES building on Route 3 this morning but her office canceled and hopes to reschedule to a later date.
