Report at June 2021 Regular Meeting

U=Union / NU = Non Union



Currently we have 46 Journeymen on Book I, 11 on Book II, 0 Apprentices available, 3 Residential, CE, CW's and 1 Tele-data Technician available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Massena - Museum Additions and Alterations was a GC Bid that went to Heritage Homes(NU) for \$250,000 (they will self-perform electric); Beaver River CSD – Capital Outlay went to Watson(U) for \$48,714; NYS Parks and Rec. – Long Sault Overlook Building Rehab went to Watson(U) for \$57,000; Northeast Clinton – High School/Middle School Phase 1 went to Watson(U) for \$1,413,600; Indian River CSD - District Wide Capital Project Phase 2, Philadelphia went to Lawman(U) for \$2,370,000; Watertown Correctional Facility Closure Bids are Cost-Plus Percentage fee price - low bidder was Scriba Electric(U) at 18%; Town of LeRay - Water Improvement Project – Water Tank Construction went to TEL, Inc.(U) for \$91,250; City of Plattsburgh – WRRF Disinfectant and Odor Control went to Triangle(U); Huen Electric(U) will be doing the new Bob Johnson Dodge & Jeep Dealership in Watertown; and JR Electric(U) landed the LeRay-Jackson Solar Project.

From Executive Board meeting

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: City of Plattsburg - WRRF Electrical Services went to Triangle(U), Clinton County Government Roof Replacement went to HR Clune(U) \$94,200 and Improvements to Wastewater Treatment Plant – Clayton went to SC Spencer(NU).

Upcoming work includes: NYPA – Saranac Digital Substation in Caddyville, Massena Substation Breaker Replacement, Lewis County General Hospital Addition and Revitalization, STL Water Tower Replacement Massena NYPA, NYPA MA-Advance Power Flow Control Project, , Port Henry- Generator Installation,ORDA – Whiteface Mountain Snowmaking Improvements, SUNY Plattsburgh – Hood Hall & Moffit Hall Renovations, SUNY Canton - Dana Hall Renovations Phase 2, Town of Plattsburg -Water Supply Improvements, Village of Lowville -Improvements to Wastewater Treatment Plant Phase II,Salt Storage facilities in Colton and Essex County Town of Lewis, Ft. Drum - New Railhead Loading Facility, Carthage Hospital,Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, the Number Three wind farm and there are several large solar projects in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5M, Indian River \$41M, Carthage \$35M, Madrid Waddington \$5M and Potsdam \$23.5M.

Currently we have 4 open calls, totaling 6 Journeymen for regular calls and 4 Journeymen for short calls. The jobs are in various areas of the jurisdiction. Local 43 in Syracuse continues to be extremely busy; as of last Friday, they had 30 open calls for a total of 74 Journeymen needed.

The critical shortage started today which allows our retirees to return to work; thus far 3 have taken us up on the offer.

International Representative Ernie Hartman performed the annual Audit last week, which went satisfactory.

Last week we attended the 75th Annual 3rd District Progress meeting virtually. Workshops were focused on organizing and politics. Emphasis on the opportunities to organize during this strong construction environment and the gains Organized Labor has made thus far during the Biden Administration.

The forecast for continued growth in construction spending was highlighted. According to the Dodge reporting service, construction spending is predicted below for the 3rd District which includes New York, New Jersey, Delaware and Pennsylvania:

- 2018 & 2019 were \$89 billion
- Projections for 2022 is \$95 billion, 2023 is \$101 billion, 2024 is \$105 billion and 2025 is \$106 billion

They also discussed the volume of proposed solar projects through 2024 in New York, New Jersey and Pennsylvania.

The Deer River and the Mad River wind farms have been withdrawn from consideration to the Public Service Commission.
