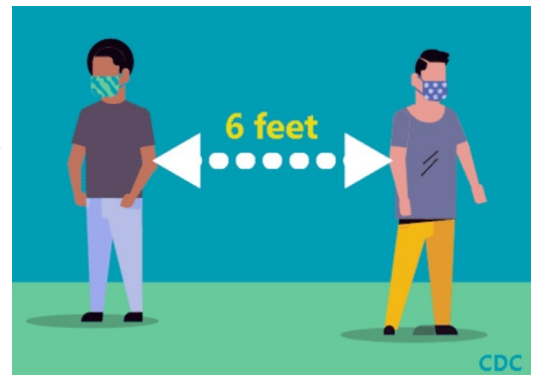

Report at May '20 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 111 Journeymen on Book I, 8 on Book II, 15 Apprentices, 4 Residential, CE, CW's and 1 Tele-data Technician available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Hermon Dekalb Central School went to Lawman(U) \$1,404,200; NYS DOT Maint. Sub headquarters OGS – Massena County Rt 42 went to Perras (U) for \$643,626; JCC Green Campus Entryway Phase 2 went to Ridley Electric(U) for \$39,899; Upstate CF – Malone - Provide Classroom & Office Space Bld 8,10 & 11 went to WJ Murray(U) for \$4,486,000; St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES – Northwest Tech Ogdensburg went to Collins-Hammond (U) \$1,890,000; St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES – Seaway Tech Norwood went to S&L (U) for \$2,021,000; St. Lawrence-Lewis BOCES – Southwest Tech Fowler went to Empire Northeast (NU) \$1,049,000; Town of LeRay – New Highway Garage went to Lawman(U) for \$464,000; ORDA – Panel board and Motor Starter Installation went to Northline (U) \$22,300; Village of Philadelphia Water Improvements went to Watson (U) \$270,000 and Watertown CSD Smart School Project went to Watson(U) for \$1,370,500.

Upcoming work includes: SUNY Plattsburgh-Memorial Hall, Town of, NYPA- Headgate Upgrades, Ausable Forks - Water System Rebid ORDA Olympic Center Revitalization Project – Phase I Tunnel, ORDA Olympic Sports Center Condensing Unit Replacement, Sunmount Tupper Lake – Replace CIT/RIT Boilers Electrical Portion, PSU Hawkins Hall Courtyard Garden, ORDA Olympic Sports Complex – Site Data Upgrades, Ticonderoga WWTP Ventilation Improvements, NYSDEC Camp Colby EEC – Multi use Building, ORDA Olympic Snow Melt Boiler Installation, NYPA – Saranac Digital Substation in Caddyville, Town of Peru Trunk Sewer Main and Pump Station Reconstruction, Copenhagen CSD, South Jefferson CSD, Fort Drum – UAV Shadow Hangar, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateauguay facility, the Number Three, Deer River, Roaring Brook and the Mad River wind farms. Several solar projects are in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Peru \$2.8 million, Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, St Lawrence-Lewis BOCES \$43.5 million, Beaver River \$12 million, Copenhagen \$5.9 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million, Norwood-Norfolk \$9.1 million, Massena \$49.6 million and Madrid Waddington \$5 million.

The construction industry is one of the first sectors slated to move back toward normalcy by Governor Cuomo and the North Country region is meeting the criteria to start back up. We are hopeful that things can get back to something closer to normal.

Since last month's meeting we have put 24 Journeymen and 9 Apprentices back to work. At the same time, we have been unable to fill calls for Journeymen for Matco at the Border Crossing and for Infrastructure at the Bob Sled and Luge Headquarters in Lake Placid. Matco has brought in 9 additional Journeymen from Binghamton, who they say will only be here for a few weeks.

I had a Zoom meeting with all the construction Business Managers in the 3rd District last week. We were required to report on how the pandemic has affected our membership and how the Union Hall is functioning. Chris Erikson from Local 3 in New York City reported 73 cases in his membership, 54 of those are out of the hospital, they had 8 deaths. He said he did not have any numbers on how many of the retired Local 3 members have been affected. Over 3500 Local 3 members were laid off due to covid-19.

I have yet to be notified of any member who has tested positive. If anyone knows any member or retiree who is in need of assistance, of any type, please let us know.
