Report at May 2021 Regular Meeting

U=Union / NU = Non Union



Currently we have 58 Journeymen on Book I, 9 on Book II, 1 Apprentice available, 3 Residential, CE, CW's and 1 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Massena CSD Capital Improvements Phase II will go to S&L (U) for \$2,569,000; Watertown Airport – Air Ambulance Hangar and Living Quarters went to Northern Pioneer (U) for \$342,000; Bailey Ford dealership in Plattsburgh is being done by Watson (U); and Watertown BOCES - P.E.S. Building Construction went to Northern Pioneer (U) for \$103,498.

*From Executive Board Meeting;*

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Carthage CSD Capital Improvements Phase 2 went to S&L (U) \$2,271,000; McCadam Cheese Plant Expansion in Chateaugay will be done by Weydman (U); St. Lawrence County Highway Department in Russell – Garage and Salt Storage went to Next Era (NU) for \$15,099; St. Lawrence County Highway Department in Canton – Garage and Salt Storage went to Tel, Inc (U) for \$291,400; and Moriah CSD – Main Building Renovation went to HR Clune (U) \$1,549,000.

Upcoming work includes: NYPA – Saranac Digital Substation in Caddyville, Massena Substation Breaker Replacement, Lewis County General Hospital Addition and Revitalization, STL Water Tower Replacement Massena NYPA, NYPA MA-Advance Power Flow Control Project, Brasher Falls CSD Capital Outlay, Watertown BOCES - P.E.S. Building Construction, Port Henry- Generator Installation, Carthage SCD Capital Improvements Phase 2, Phase 1 Capital Improvements at Northeastern Clinton High/Middle School, St. Lawrence County Highway Department – Garage and Salt Storage, ORDA – Whiteface Mountain Snowmaking Improvements, SUNY Plattsburgh – Hood Hall & Moffit Hall Renovations, Beaver River CSD – Capital Outlay Rebid, NYS Parks and Rec. – Long Sault Overlook Building Rehab, Indian River CSD - District Wide Capital Project Phase 2, Ft. Drum - New Railhead Loading Facility, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, the Number Three and Deer River wind farms, along with several large solar projects in the works.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3M, Brushton-Moira \$11.5M, Indian River \$41M, Carthage \$35M, Madrid Waddington \$5M and Potsdam \$23.5M.

Currently we have several open calls - totaling 5 Journeymen for regular calls and 2 Journeymen for short calls. The jobs are in various areas of the jurisdiction.

I have spent a good deal of time over the last few week tracking the proposed solar work in the planning stages. At this point, I am concentrating on the large projects over 100 megawatt. There is a total of 9 slated for our jurisdiction that are of that size. I filed paper work with the New York State Public Service Commission (PSC) for Local 910 to be a party of interest, which puts the Developer on notice that we are tracking the project and the PSC will e-mail me anytime the Developer takes an action.

In several meetings and webinars, we have been updated on the positive effects that the Biden administration is having on the National Labor Relations Board and the Department of Labor. President Biden appointed, and the Senate approved, Marty Walsh to be the Secretary of Labor. Walsh is a second generation member of Laborers Union Local 223 in Boston. He was elected secretary-treasurer and later President of the Boston Metropolitan District Building Trades Council. In 2014 Walsh was elected Mayor of Boston, serving 7 years. "There's lots of work to do in Washington D.C.," Walsh said. "There's lots of work to do around workplace safety, there's lots of work to do on unemployment, there's lots of work to do about workforce development." Walsh received bipartisan support in the Senate.

I have been asked by the Jefferson County Industrial Development agency to attend their next meeting to discuss the possibility of inserting local labor language into their policies for developments they assist.
