Report at October '19 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 45 Journeymen on Book I, 8 on Book II, 0 Apprentices out of work, 0 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data technician available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Madrid DDSO fire alarm will be done by Weydman(U), Weydman will also be doing the Black River Trail electrical, and General Brown CSD-Phase 2 had Watson(U) low bidder at \$130,108.

From Executive Board:

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Tupper Lake Public Library Mechanical Upgrades was a Mechanical GC bid to K&L Heating and Plumbing who will sub electrical to Weydman(U); DOT Region7 Jefferson County-Electrical Components Upgrade went to Lawman(U) for \$133,000, Dow was low and their bid was rejected for not listing subs; and City of Plattsburgh Protection Ave. Underground Utilities will be done by Northline(U).

Upcoming work includes: Fort Drum Museum, Town Of Lewis-Salt Storage Shed, Jay Community Center, SUNY Canton-Wicks Hall, Ogdensburg Airport-Runway Lighting, Cranberry Lake Campground-Water System Improvements, Watertown International Airport-Runway Rehab, Ogdensburg Wastewater Upgrades, Belleville-Henderson CSD-Capital Outlay Project Rebid, DOT Region7 Jefferson County-Electrical Components Upgrade, Watertown City Schools, Several Olympic Regional Development Projects in the Lake Placid area, Carthage Hospital, Agri-Mark's Chateauguay facility, the Number Three, Deer River, Roaring Brook and the Mad River windfarms. There are several solar projects.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Peru \$2.8 million, Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES \$18.5 million, Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, St. Lawrence Central \$17.7 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, Jeff-Lewis BOCES \$20 million, St Lawrence-Lewis BOCES \$43.5 million, Beaver River \$12 million, Copenhagen \$5.9 million, Indian River \$41 million, Carthage \$35 million, and Norwood-Norfolk \$9.1 million.

The work has stayed steady with a few layoffs and it has taken a few extra days to fill some job calls.

Yesterday was the last day for the critical shortage that allowed retired members to return to work and still draw their pension. Most of them had ended work already. We had a total of 8 retirees take advantage of this.

The work picture going forward continues to look very good for Central New York. There have been several large projects announced in Local 43 Syracuse's jurisdiction. The Utica area has a proposed \$44 million-dollar sporting venue, a new \$600 million-dollar hospital and just announced is a proposed \$1 billion-dollar semi-conductor chip plant in Marcy, a company called Cree will manufacture electronic power chips used in electric cars and 5G networks. Also announced recently is a proposal distribution center building in Liverpool that would be nearly 3.8 million square feet of distribution and warehouse space. That would be the 2nd largest distribution center in the world. The developer will not confirm who the customer is, many suspect it is Amazon. One other theory is that they will use this warehouse to begin distributing by drones. There is quite a bit of opposition to this project because of the traffic it would generate in the area.

The carpenters are done on the new building, yet to be installed is the stair railings which are being built, the overhead door should also be installed this week. Lights will follow.

Work continues on the roof of the Plattsburgh building. The contractor has completed half of what will be done this year.
