Report at September Regular Meeting

U=Union / NU = Non Union

Business Manager's Report:

Currently we have 42 Journeymen on Book I, 1 on Book II, 2 Apprentices, 29 CE/CW's and 2 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: JCC Dulles Building Renovation-S&L \$930,000, and St. Lawrence County Courthouse-TEL Inc. \$388,990.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include (from Executive Meeting): River Hospital Renovations-S&L (No Price), SUNY Potsdam Flagg Hall-TEL Inc. (No Price), Hopkinton Fire Station-Next Era (NU) \$192,250, Warneck Pump Station FEMA Repairs Scriba \$95,000, City of Ogdensburg Generator- S&L \$92,000, and SUNY Canton EV Charging Stations-Tadcon (NU) \$186,500.

Upcoming work includes: Upstate Correctional Facility Cold Storage Building, Saranac Lake Garage Building Upgrades, Ogdensburg Correctional Facility Closure, SUNY Canton Chiller Replacement, SUNY Canton Turf Field Replacement, Carthage Wastewater Plant Upgrades, Lisbon CSD Capital Improvement, Lewis County EV Charging Infrastructure, Beekmantown CSD Re-Bid, Morristown CSD Phase Two, Ausable Valley CSD Capital Project, and Sunmount DDSO Loading Dock.

Upcoming work includes (from Executive Meeting): SUNY Potsdam Replace Piping, South Jefferson CSD COP, Rehabilitation of 1223 Pickering St. Ogdensburg, and Upstate Correctional Facility Cold Storage Building.

I attended the Membership Development Conference in Chicago. We added over 24,000 A members last year, which is the most since 1979. Overall A membership stands at over 860,000. I also learned about some updates to the per capita reporting system. Most of the locals in the state have open calls or are expecting to have them in the near future. The importance of manning our work was stressed so that we do not come out of this construction boon with less Union Density and Market Share.

A large 25 MW solar project in Ticonderoga is expected to start in two weeks. This will be done under the Tri-Trades agreement which includes IBEW, the laborers, and operators. We will be installing the solar panels with CS Energy and doing the rest of the electrical work with Mass Electric. It is critical that we get enough people to install the panels because under the Tri-Trades Agreement, if one Trade cannot man the work the others can provide manpower. This could affect work assignments in the future. We have fought hard to keep the panel installation away from the carpenters and laborers, now we have to make sure we can provide the manpower.

I attended the Third District Progress Meeting in Pittsburgh last week. Most of the locals in the state have open calls or are expecting to have them soon. There was again an emphasis on filling job calls to make sure our contractors continue to bid work. We have a couple of unfilled calls for Gross Electric in Plattsburgh and Lake Placid. We are also expecting unfilled calls for the Ticonderoga Solar Project, so we are ramping up our organizing efforts. We will continue to bring new members in, upgrade their skills through training so they can eventually become Journeyman Wireman.
