Report at August 2023 Regular Meeting

Currently we have 44 Journeymen on Book I, 5 on Book II, 7 Apprentices available, 6 Residential-CE/CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Akwesasne Housing Authority-Generator Replacement-Next Era (NU) \$91,800; SUNY Plattsburgh-Memorial Hall- WJ Murray; Renzi Brothers Addition-Marzullo Electric; and Upstate Correctional Facility Elevator Upgrades-S&L \$62,955.

From Executive Board Report: St. Lawrence Appleton Arena-S&L; Adirondack Cf Building 1 & 20 Roof Replacement-Weydman \$88,000; Town of Chazy Sewer pump station upgrades-Weydman; Parishville-Hopkinton CSD COP-Zero Draft Commercial (NU); Replacement of windows and lights for Flower Memorial Library- Zero Draft Commercial (NU); SUNY Canton- CARC Replace VESDA Fire Alarm System-TEL Inc. \$57,097; and Eisenhower & Snell Lock Compressor Building Feeders- Collins-Hammond \$675,243.

Upcoming work includes: Fort Drum Police/Fire Station Repairs, Clifton Fine CSD-Renovations, St. Lawrence Psychiatric Center-Generator Replacement, St. Regis Falls WWTP UV System, St. Regis Mohawk Tribe Diabetes Center Phase 2.Fort Drum MQ9 Shops, Fort Drum Flight Training Unit, Town Of Hermon Water System Improvements, Malone Housing Authority Electrical Upgrades, Riverview Correctional Facility Replace Heat Exchangers, and Tupper Lake Reconstruct Rail Platforms.

The proposed Green Hydrogen Project in Massena continues to move forward. The Town Planning Board, as lead agency, has determined that the project will not have a significant adverse environmental impact. NYPA's 345 KV Line will provide power to the new facility. Michels Power has been awarded the Substation work. The project will include an electrolyzer building, a compressor building, a water treatment building, a control building, a terminal building, and large emergency generators. I attended a virtual meeting with the Construction management team for this project. They expect some electrical work to start in the spring of 2024 with the majority of work for electricians to be in 2025 and 2026.

There are several large-scale solar projects proposed in our area for 2024-2026. Through the Inflation Reduction Act there are enhanced tax credits available to the developers if the project is done under Davis-Bacon prevailing wage rates. There are also apprenticeship requirements. I am reaching out to developers to let them know how we can help them meet the requirements for these tax incentives.

I attended a NYS Business Managers' meeting last week. There was discussion about proposed changes that the IBEW and NECA have agreed to that would affect our apprenticeship program. There was also discussion about a Tri-Trades agreement that would cover solar projects. The trades involved would be electricians, laborers and operators.
