Currently we have 54 Journeymen on Book I, 9 on Book II, 0 Apprentice out of work, 9 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last week include: Best Buy Watertown-Renovation electrical work will be done by NYTRIC (U); Thompson Park Splash Pad, electrical work will be done by J&R (U); Schroon Lake School-Lighting Upgrades had Integra LED (NU) low at \$90,740; Brasher Falls CSD-Capital Outlay Project had Empire NE (NU) low at \$42,000; Essex County ñ DC Power System had a low bid by Capital Digitronics (NU) \$27,068; Brushton-Moira CSD-Phase 1 will be done by Perras Construction Services (U) \$396,847; Village of Lowville-5 Streets Roadway Reconstruction/Pumpstation project electrical had a low bid by New Century (U) of \$133,602; and Phase 4 of the Samaritan Medical project was awarded to NYTRIC (U).

From Executive Board Report

Jobs bid in the last week include: DANC-Generator Replacement Rodman went to B&D Enterprises (NU) \$48,625, Sunmount DDSO Tupper Lake-Duress System Replacement had Weydman (U) low bidder at \$617,400, NYSDOT Salt Storage Rt 12 Watertown went to New Century (U) for \$20,199, NYSDOT Salt Storage Routes 95 and 37 Hogansburg will go to Empire Northeast (NU) for \$18,900, NYSDOT Salt Storage Bostwick Street Lowville will be done by Northern Pioneer (U) for \$18,900, and Beekmantown School-Renovations went to S&L (U) for \$1,892,000,

Upcoming work includes: Several Dollar Stores, Town Of Fine-Water System Improvement, NYPA-Generator Upgrades, Fort Drum-LED Lighting Various Buildings, SUNY Potsdam Lehman Hall Phase VIII, NYPA-TLEM Switchyard Project, City Of Ogdensburg-Street Lighting Upgrade, SUNY Plattsburgh-Whiteface Hall, Canton CSD-Capital Outlay Project, St. Regis Mohawk Tribe ñHealth Services Building, Fairfield Inn and Suites-Canton, DANC-Generator Replacement, Carthage CSD-Generator Bus Garage, Chateaugay CSD- Capital Improvement Project, SUNY Potsdam-Music Center Rehab, NYSDOT Salt Storage buildings, Watertown, Lowville & Hogansburg, Beekmantown School-Renovations, SUNY Plattsburgh Bathroom Renovations, Sunmount DDSO Tupper Lake-Duress System Replacement, Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, Norsk Titanium, a new development for a wind farm on Galloo Island, and the Copenhagen & Mad River wind farms.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Clifton-Fine \$3.6 million, Brasher Falls \$10 million and Peru \$2.8 million, Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES \$18.5 million, General Brown \$9.37 million, Parishville-Hopkinton \$2.3 million, St. Lawrence Central \$17.7 million, Brushton-Moira \$11.5 million, and Jeff-Lewis BOCES \$20 million.

With the number on Book I dropping from 84 to 54 over the last month, it is clear that the construction season has started. Additionally over the last month, we have referred 10 Journeymen off Book II, all to projects on the Eastern half of the jurisdiction. The largest call was for 20 Journeymen for Kasselmann Electric at Adirondack Correctional Facility in Ray Brook working a scheduled 5x10's. We started looking for Journeymen last Monday and as of today we have 12; 5 Local 910 members and the rest travelers. The difficulty filling calls in that area will continue throughout the summer. It is unfortunate that it is not busy in all areas of the Local. The opposite situation is happening on the western end of the jurisdiction; we had a call for 2 Journeymen at the Border Crossing at Wellesley Island, and 15 Local 910 members responded.

3rd District International Representative, Ernie Hartman, visited me last week to perform a Local Union audit. These audits require me to gather a great deal of information which Ernie had me put on a thumb drive so he could download the documentation. It is a lot of work but I think it is good that the International is going to these lengths to make sure everyone's house is in order. As I have mentioned previously the Trump administration has significantly increased the number of investigators with the Office of Labor-Management Standards (OLMS) who conduct audits to determine if unions are complying with the law.
