Currently we have 87 Journeyman on Book I, 14 on Book II, 7 Apprentice, 5 Residential, CE, CW's and 0 Tele-data Technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last week include: Plattsburgh City Schools-Exterior Lights went to S&L (U) for \$58,900; Ticonderoga-Water Treatment Plant went to Gross Electric (U) for \$1,564,000; JCC- Campus Wide Mechanical Project had S&L (U) low bidder at \$54,455; DANC- Booster Pump Station Generators went to Empire Northeast (NU) for \$334,900; 3-Story Addition at the Samaritan Medical Center went to NYTRIC (U); and Beekmantown-Salt Storage Facility went to Triangle (U) for \$42,500.

From Executive Board Report

Jobs bid in the last week include: SUNY Potsdam-New Childcare Center was a GC bid to Bette Cring who we are told will use Dow Electric (NU); Dollar General Town of Plattsburgh will be done by ACE Electric (NU); Dollar General in Cadyville went to KMAC (NU); and Ticonderoga CSD-Phase 2 went to HR Clune(U) \$1,169,000.

Upcoming work includes: Several Dollar Stores, Plattsburgh FedEx Distribution Facility is being rebid, Fort Drum Mountain Community Homes new houses, Town Of Constable-Petroleum Containment Building, Watertown Airport- Security Enhancements, Malone Airport-Runway Lights, Ticonderoga CSD-Phase 2, NYPA-Electric Services for New STL Building, Beekmantown-Salt Storage Facility, Town Of Saranac-Standish Water District, SUNY Potsdam-New Childcare Center, Town Of Fine-Water System Improvement, Massena Airport-Taxiway's Rehabilitation, Seaway Area Tech Center-Improvement, Morristown Library-Addition Expansion, SUNY Canton-Emergency Lighting, High Falls Apartments-Fire Alarm Project, SUNY Canton- Exterior Rehab Dana Hall, Town of Plattsburgh-Rt. 9 Pump Station and restoration of Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, Norsk Titanium, a new development for a wind farm on Galloo Island, and the Copenhagen & Mad River wind farms.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Clifton-Fine \$3.6 million, Brasher Falls \$10 million and Peru \$2.8 million, Thousand Islands School 6.9 Million, Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES \$18.5 million, and General Brown \$9.37 million.

Work continues to stay about the same. Little or no hiring recently in the Watertown area. We did have had a few calls in the Plattsburgh end. I expect that to continue. There are work opportunities in several Pennsylvania Locals. Last week Local 607 Shamokin called me to see if we had anyone looking for work, as they had 5 open calls at the time. I called some of our Journeyman who I thought may go; one of those Journeyman got out to work there and reported the job is working 4x10's: 8 on Friday, 8 on Saturday and that it is a good job. Local 910 Journeyman have a very good reputation in Shamokin because of how our Journeyman have performed there in the past. Local 363 in the Catskill Mountain area is also busy and one of our members got out to work there immediately for a 40-hour call. You can talk to me after the meeting if you want more information.

There is still no more word on the Thousand Islands Border job or Norsk Titanium.

I have been told that Elmira Local 139 Business Manager, Ernie Hartman, will be our next New York State International Service Rep., taking over for Larry Davis on August 1st. Ernie is a seasoned Business Manager and in my opinion was the best choice for the job. Ernie is currently the chairman of the New York State IBEW Business Managers group and has a seat on the New York State Apprenticeship Council, as well as the Southern Tier Regional Economic Council.
