Spencer \$259,200 (NU), Seaway Area Tech Center-Improvements was a GC-Harvey Excavating for \$167,590 electric-Northern Pioneer (U), Morristown Library-Addition went to Phil Cree for \$6,600 (NU), SUNY Canton-Emergency Lighting S&L for \$50,650 (U), JCC Cafeteria Renovations went to Jordstat \$25,630 (NU), Town Of Saranac-Standish Water District went to Triangle for \$118,000 (U), Tupper Lake-Water System Improvements went to Weydman at \$559,500 (U), Town Of Henderson-Service Upgrade went to J&R for \$25,500 (U), and Plattsburgh Airport-Renovation of ARFFF went to Dow base bid was \$14,376 (NU).

From Executive Board meeting

Jobs bid in the last week include: High Falls Apartments-Fire Alarm Project went to All-Tech for \$10,299 (NU), Watertown Correctional Facility-Water Heaters went to Dow for \$37,141(NU), Colton-Pierrepont CSD-Capital Improvement Project went to Watson for \$395,200(U), and SUNY Canton-Southworth Library Rehab Mechanical & Electrical systems was a GC Bid that went to Blackhorse for \$379,23; they will sub the Electric to S&L (U).

Upcoming work includes: Several Dollar Stores, Plattsburgh FedEx Distribution facility is being rebid, Fort Drum Mountain Community Homes new houses, Town Of Constable-Petroleum Containment Building, Malone Airport-Runway Lights, NYPA-Electric Services for New STL Building, Town Of Fine-Water System Improvement, Massena Airport-Taxiway Rehabilitation, High Falls Apartments-Fire Alarm Project, SUNY Canton- Exterior Rehab Dana Hall, Marine Academy Classroom Project-Mineville NY, Watertown Correctional Facility-Water Heaters, Malone CSD-Install Audio Equipment , Plattsburgh Airport- Runway Project , Colton Pierrepont CSD-Capital Improvement Project, JCC- Theater Sound System, Cedar Point-Bathhouse Renovation, Upstate Correctional Facility-Rec Pens, Ray Brook Prison-Fire Alarm Upgrades, Potsdam CSD-LGI Room Alterations, SUNY Canton-Upgrade Cyber Café, NYPA-Generator Upgrades, Town of Plattsburgh-Rt. 9 Pump Station and restoration of Agri-Mark's Chateaugay facility, Norsk Titanium, a new development for a wind farm on Galloo Island, and the Copenhagen & Mad River wind farms.

School projects that are in various stages of development: Clifton-Fine \$3.6 million, Brasher Falls \$10 million, Peru \$2.8 million, Thousand Islands School 6.9 Million, Franklin-Essex-Hamilton BOCES \$18.5 million, and General Brown \$9.37 million.

Considering we are now into the month of June, the year is starting off extremely slow as far as job calls here at Local 910. At the Building Trades meeting yesterday the other trades are also very slow. We have had a few more Journeymen get out to work in Local 363 and 2 got out in Local 241 (Ithaca) and one in Local 43 (Oswego). There are also several Pennsylvania Locals that are busy.

Still no word on the Thousand Island Border Crossing or NORSEK Titanium projects at this time.

The New York State Labor Commissioner, Roberta Reardon, will be holding a Labor Roundtable Discussion Wednesday, June 14, here at our Hall for all area Labor Representatives.

At the Fort Drum Regional Liaison meeting last Thursday they reported that the decision on siting of a possible East Coast Missile Defense facility will now be in November or December. On a positive note the Missile Defense Agency did have a successful interceptor missile defense test over the Pacific Ocean. The U.S. has tested the interceptor system 19 times since 1999, succeeding about half the time. This successful test should help the MDA's reputation.
