Report at May Regular Meeting

Business Manager's Report:

Currently we have 40 Journeyman on Book I, 0 on Book II, 0 Apprentices, 1 CE/CW's and 1 Tele-data technicians available for work.

Jobs bid in the last two weeks include: Theresa WWTP Improvements-S&L \$1,876,000, Waddington Clark House Renovation-Empire Northeast (NU) \$363,000, South Jefferson Wilson Elementary School-Empire Northeast (NU) \$62,650, Brushton Moira CSD-Next ERA (NU) \$1,650,000, Saranac CSD-Next ERA (NU) \$36,200, River Hospital ASI 3 Radiology-S&L No Price, Copenhagen CSD \$1,960,000, Brushton Fire Department Addition-Dow No Price, Beaver River CSD-Empire Northeast (NU) \$97,690, Jefferson County Social Security Entrance Addition & Renovation-Tri County(NU) \$239,000, Indian River CSD Capital Project Phase 1-Empire Northeast (NU) \$609,000.

Upcoming work includes: Depauville WWTS, Capital Project Phase 1 Indian River, Rehabilitation of Terminal Apron Potsdam Municipal Airport, Renovations Adult Learning Center Jefferson BOCES, Veterans Memorial Park Improvements Rebid, Alterations to Victory Family Housing Unit 20 Massena HA, EV Charging System Ray Brook Regional Office OGS, SRMT Upgrades to Transfer Station Phase 2&3 Fort Covington, Replace Fire Alarm System Ranger School Wanakena, Sunmount DDSO Security System Upgrades.

I had a meeting last week with the Director of Intergovernmental Relations for NYPA. We talked about the Alcoa Dam project that has been going on as well as some upcoming projects (large overhead crane replacements, building projects) and a new grant program they are working on.

We continue to struggle filling calls. There are open calls throughout our jurisdiction, I am concerned our contractors will not keep bidding work if we cannot get people for them. We are starting to see this happen with a few projects having only one or two bidders on them. I have been in contact with a Canadian Local about getting some unemployed JW's to help us fill calls. We will see where that goes.

The St. Lawrence County Planning Board met for a site plan review for the Data Center NYDIG is proposing at the former Alcoa East Site. There are 3 proposed buildings, each of them is 400,000 square feet or larger. The Data Center would require approximately 635 MW of Power. Currently the Massena Dam produces approximately 800 MW of power. One of the most unpopular things about Data Centers is the Power and Water Consumption. This application proposes a closed loop system that will not take water from the river or discharge back into it. NYDIG is interested in talking to the Building Trades about support for this project, once they get some of these initial steps completed.

The Trump Administration has stripped collective bargaining rights away from 600 civilian workers at Fort Drum. Trump issued an executive order banning unions from many Federal Agencies over "National Security Concerns." It is difficult to think that this is anything other than Union Busting, when the Administration was trying to make DOGE cuts the Unions stood up for their workers so now their contracts have been terminated. I think we need to be prepared for some form of National Right to Work laws under this administration. The traditional grassroots campaigns with calls and letters to your representatives won't work when everything is done through executive orders. We need our elected officials to stand up and reclaim their power but very few have the courage to do this.
